This month, I have asked my wife Liz to share something with you. I hope you like what she has to say and will be willing to accept her challenge.

The other day I was watching a video message from our New Wine Local Regional Director and something he said has really resonated with me. He said we should not be practicing 'social distancing'.

Don't panic, he did not mean that we should be getting close to each other and ignoring the guidelines. It is important that we follow the Covid-19 rules and keep 2 metres from those we do not live or bubble with to protect us and them from the virus.

What he was suggesting was that we should be 'physically distant' from one another, not 'socially distant'.

We need to stay Physically Distanced and Socially Connected.

As the days get colder and the nights darker it is going to get harder for us all living under the restrictions, which could get tighter as cases grow. At a time when so many in our communities are already feeling isolated, alone and scared of what the next few months will bring it is vital that we make the effect to stay connected with them and each other. I am challenging all of us (me included) to:

- 1. Choose six people and make a point of contacting them regularly. You may want to phone or video call them each week or suggest going on a physically distanced walk together or meet up over zoom to play a game.
- 2. Choose six people and pray for them each week. Pray that they will know the love of Jesus and feel him close to them.

Let us make sure that whilst we are maintaining physical distance from each other we are staying socially connected.

Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." *John 13: 34-35*

The numbers attending Church will continue to be limited, but we don't think there's any need to let us know in advance if you wish to come. Hopefully there will be enough room for all those who would like to attend.

For your safety and the safety of others, face coverings must be worn by all who are not exempt from doing so. Please be prepared to queue outside the Church until you are shown to a seat (which may not be your usual one). Strict social distancing between households/support bubbles will be in place. And as much as we would want to greet one another with a handshake, warm hug or a kiss, that won't be possible either. Please follow any one way system that is in place in Church and make use of the hand sanitiser at the entrance and exit of the Church. Currently we are not permitted to sing in Church so our services will not include hymns at this time. We are not allowed to serve refreshments after the service and that is probably just as well as access to the toilet will not be possible either. And for some good news: We can now turn the Church heating on to help keep you a little warmer.

Finally, we would ask you to choose which church you will attend and not switch between different congregations as this will help to reduce the risk of virus transmission. You may think that these measures will spoil your worshipping experience, but we are so looking forward to gathering in a building that has been a place of prayer and spiritual support in the village for so many people over many years. Being Prepared *Matthew 10:1-13*

As well as 'Be Prepared' being the motto of the Scouts, it is something we are told to do in the parable of the 10 Bridesmaids which can be found in Matthew's Gospel.

We all prepare for some things: We take bags to the shops to carry our shopping home. We take sun cream with us on holiday. We might even have a birthday card at home in preparation for that forgotten birthday. But we also have to be prepared for the much bigger things and Jesus tells this parable to teach us the importance of being prepared.


Half of the bridesmaids were unprepared and didn't have enough oil for their lamps, but half of them were well prepared and had plenty of oil, so could go and meet the bridegroom. If we think of Jesus as the bridegroom and ourselves as the bridesmaids — or page boys if you prefer ① the parable tells us that we will meet Jesus one day, and that we must be prepared for when it happens. How? By having Jesus in our lives, loving Him and knowing that we are loved by Him. Then, because we don't know exactly when we will meet Jesus, we will still be prepared.

On the 11th November we will remember those that lost their lives, not just in the 1st and 2nd world wars, but in all the conflicts since. These men and women were prepared to die for their country and for that alone we should honour them and thank them for what they did.

We might not have a Remembrance Day service as normal this year, but we can still wear our poppy and perhaps even make a donation to the Poppy Appeal online.



On the next page, colour the poppy in with a red pen on both sides or use it as a template on some red paper. Cut it out carefully and then bend the points to the middle. Use a split pin to hold them together. Add a paper straw or a stick for the stalk and a small piece of black paper for the middle of the poppy. Put it somewhere you can see it and.... Remember!
