Finally, we would ask you to choose which church you will attend and not switch between different congregations as this will help to reduce the risk of virus transmission. You may think that these measures will spoil your worshipping experience, but we are so looking forward to gathering in a building that has been a place of prayer and spiritual support in the village for so many people over many years. ### What can I give him?

After all the excitement of Christmas and New Year everything goes very quiet. New Year resolutions are made and quickly broken, school and work start back and Easter seems a long, long way away. Christmas is soon forgotten! But! Christmas isn't over quite yet. On Wednesday 6th January we celebrate Epiphany, The Bible's account of the wise men following a star to visit Jesus.

Although the Nativity story tells us that the wise men arrived at the stable just after Jesus was born, Matthew 2: 1-12 tells us that they actually arrived quite a while later. Mary, Joseph and Jesus were still in Bethlehem, but living in a house and Matthew refers to Jesus as a child, not a baby.

The wise men still brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh; but what, if you were going to visit Jesus, would you take as a gift?

One of my favourite carols is a poem written by Christina Rossetti. In the Bleak Midwinter. Look it up to find all the words, but here are just three verses.

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan, Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago.

Our God, Heaven cannot hold Him, nor earth sustain; Heaven and earth shall flee away when He comes to reign. In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed The Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ.

### **Building a Prayer**

Sometimes it can be hard to pray, especially with children, so here's an idea for families to use, although anyone can enjoy this activity.

Find something you can build with – Lego, duplo, building blocks, or if you don't have those things, books or even cushions could work.

Place a block down and say a prayer for someone or something – you don't need special language or fancy words and it doesn't need to be a long prayer; you might just say; 'God I'm praying about school because I'm finding it hard, please help me'

Add another block and say another prayer, how about a thank you prayer; 'Thank you God for....'


Each time you add a block say a short prayer, you might talk about things you want to pray for before you start. You can pray for other people and situations, you might ask God to bless people you know with the things they need or pray for people you don't know such as those who don't have a



home, you could say thank you for different things, you could ask God for help for yourself – anything you want to or feel you need to.

When you've finished, look at your prayers all built together, say thank you

to God for listening. You might like to take a photo of the prayer building you have created (you can share this with us if you'd like to), or knowing all your prayers have now been heard by God and are safe with Him, you might like to shout a big 'Amen' as you knock your creation down!
