I am writing this letter to you just a few days after watching the Taliban enter the city of Kabul with complete ease and take control over Afghanistan declaring an end to the 20-year war. One Afghan Christian has said, "It's a heart-breaking day for the citizens of Afghanistan and an even more dangerous time to be a Christian. Secret believers in Afghanistan are especially vulnerable. Prior to Taliban rule, they already had a very difficult time living out their faith, as they had to keep it secret from their families for fear of being shunned, or worse, killed. Now that the Taliban is in power, their vulnerability increases tenfold. It would be almost impossible to be a follower of Jesus in this country. We are monitoring the situation, but this is the time for us to ask God to have mercy not only on His people, but on this country as a whole."

Afghanistan was already number two on the Open Doors' World Watch List meaning it is the second most dangerous place in the world to be a Christian believer. As people who live in safety, with freedom to attend worship whenever we like, I would urge you to join with me in praying for Afghanistan. Here are five ways to pray for Afghanistan today (as published by Open Doors).

- Please pray for the small group of believers in the country.
 They are walking on eggshells and are uncertain who to trust.
 Pray that they find strength, wisdom, and supernatural peace in God's promises.
- Pray for the displaced. A new wave of refugees is expected to come from Afghanistan to many parts of the Middle East and the rest of the world. Pray for God's protection and provision over them in their journeys.
- Pray for the women. Many women fear that the Taliban rule would mean they would be stripped of opportunities for education. Women involved in education during the past years could also be at risk – pray for their protection.

- Pray for the sick. Though underreported in international media, Covid-19 cases are spiking in the country and hospitals are limited in what they can offer. There is no certainty as to how the healthcare system will be able to sustain itself with the new Taliban government. Pray that the healthcare system will not collapse.
- Pray that the country will not be a haven for extremists. The Taliban government of 20 years ago are known enablers of extremist Islamic organisations. With their newfound control over Afghanistan, the country could be host to a new generation of terror groups.

I don't know what else we can do for the people of Afghanistan except to hold them in our prayers. Will you join with me in praying for our Afghan brothers and sisters every day? And, as we do, may God have mercy upon them.

Mission Partners

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Over the next few months I am going to share with you some of the work each of these charities have been undertaking and some ideas of how you can support them in prayer.

This month's charity is:



CPAS stands for the Church Pastoral Aid Society and its purpose is to work with churches and leaders to help them share the gospel afresh in each generation. Their current ministry involves the oversight of Venture and Falcon holidays, appointing evangelical clergy to their nearly 700 patronage parishes, of which Christ Church is one, and training, resourcing and supporting leaders for mission and evangelism.

It was founded on the 19 February 1836 by prominent Christians, including the pioneering social reformer Lord Shaftesbury, as a Christian response to the massive social change brought about by the Industrial Revolution. What were once small village churches found themselves with the new urban poor on their doorsteps.

Lord Shaftesbury and his friends stepped in to set up a new charity that would resource these churches to cope with this change. Their aim was simple: the gospel should be taken 'to every person's door, with a single eye to the glory of God'.

They achieved this for many decades by giving parishes grants to enable them to employ extra lay and ordained workers in fast-growing urban parishes. The Rev Patrick Bronte, rector of Haworth (and father of the famous novelists) was one of the first to receive a grant which he used to employ a curate.

CPAS helped churches become more effective in sharing the gospel in a variety of ways, including beginning to run Christian holidays for young people. Today around a 100 holidays, now called Ventures and Falcons, are run each year catering for 8-18's. Their main adult resources include Growing Leaders, the Arrow Leadership Programme and our Lead On email, which over 6,000 leaders receive every month for free.

They are looking forward to 2025 and their prayer and aspiration is to see:

- Every church a pathway to faith
- Every Christian a courageous witness
- Every leader a catalyst for evangelism
- Every child the chance to explore Jesus.

Here are some things that you can pray for:

- Sponsoring Thank God for all the Ventures and Falcons that have taken place this summer and ask him to continue to work in the lives of the children & young people who attended them.
- Praise God for the fruitful partnership between CPAS and Worcester Diocese and ask him to use CPAS' input to ministerial training and Calling Young Disciples to help churches thrive and grow.
- The launch of the first Leading Evangelism Learning Hub and for James Lawrence who leads it and the groups of leaders taking part.
- For wisdom as decisions are made about which events and programmes will remain online and which will be in physical venues.
- Pray for those at CPAS involved in the decision process of appointing new clergy to their patronage parishes.

Nature Prayers

Autumn is approaching, I've already noticed some leaves changing colour and trees beginning to drop their fruit – I even saw a conker a couple of days ago!

As with every season, Autumn brings change, our world begins to look different so here's a prayer idea which involves an autumn nature walk.



Go for a walk – there are lots of green areas local to the village – the parks, nature trails at the Mountsorrel & Rothley

Community Heritage Centre, Cossington Meadows. Or you might want to drive to Beacon Hill or Swithland Woods. As you walk, take time to notice the changes that are happening around us, enjoy this wonderful time of year in creation.

Remember to take a bag so that you can collect some of Autumns treasures – fallen leaves, acorns, beech nuts and shells, conkers, sycamore keys, and pinecones.

Here's some different ways you might like to pray using the things you collect;

- Leaves look at the different colours the leaves have changed to become. Think of
 places in the world where change is needed if you have a world map, you could
 place a leaf on those places, ask God to help to bring change to those places.
- Acorns look how small the acorn is, now think about how big the tree was that it came from. The huge tree grew from the small acorn! I wonder if you feel big like the tree or small like the acorn? Ask God to help you grow into the person He has created you to be.



- Pinecones is your pinecone open or closed? I wonder if you are feeling open or closed to God's love? As you hold or look at the pinecone, ask God to help you to be open to Him and His love.
- Conkers the Horse Chestnut tree goes through lots of changes to create the
 conker, white flowers bloom in the spring before spikey shells appear in which the
 wonderful shiny conkers grow! I wonder if there are changes happening in your life.
 Sometimes change can be a bit scary, maybe you're feeling 'spikey' about changes in
 your life, but without change we wouldn't have the wonderful shiny conkers! Ask
 God to be with you when you feel unsure about changes happening around you. If
 you are worried about something changing, give it to God to look after for you and
 ask him to give you peace. You could take a conker and gently throw it into the
 garden as a symbol that you have given it over to God.



You might come up with some other ideas for praying with other things you've found – be as creative as you like, God loves to hear from us!

The group will be both in person and via zoom for those who find it easier to take part that way due to family and work commitments.


We will be following The Prayer Course, which is an eight-week journey through the Lord's Prayer covering the following sessions:


