Please Note: <u>No Morning Prayer from Tuesday 16th to</u> Friday 26th November Inclusive. I wonder if you are a regular user of a dictionary? I read this week that almost one hundred revised and new entries and senses have been added to the Oxford English Dictionary in their October 2021 special update, including *climate crisis*, *extreme weather*, and mass extinction.



Words can change their meaning; and, in different contexts, can have polar opposite definitions. For example, the word 'bad' has the definition: 'of poor quality; unfavourable; adverse' as well as 'Informal: good; excellent'. No wonder we sometimes get confused. Put together in a story, poem or song, words have the power to bring adventure and excitement, love and passion, fear and horror. Words can bring us to laughter as well as to tears and sometimes both at the same time.

Words can be used to leak sensitive information to the press but also to secure sensitive information in the form of passwords. There is even a daily changing password for after-hours entry to the Tower of London, used by Tower staff, residents and the soldiers on duty

We all use words in various ways. Sometimes our words are encouraging and uplifting; sometimes we use words that are hurtful and bring division. James writing to the early Christians reminds us of the importance of using our words wisely.

"Anyone who is never at fault in what they say is perfect, able to keep their whole body in check. ... The tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. ... [it] is a world of evil among the parts of the body. ... It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be." (James 3)

As one who is equally guilty of sometimes speaking without due care, may I encourage you to think carefully about the words you use when communicating with others so that we build one another up in love. You may

like to use this verse from the psalms in prayer as you ask God for help in speaking well:

"May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, O Lord, my Rock, and my Redeemer." (Psalm 19.14)

Starting Rite is a baby-centred course run over 5 weeks for mum's or dad's and babies who aren't yet on the move. It includes lots of fun activities - singing, storytelling, bathing, baby-touch, and other multi-sensory play.

There are 5 sessions:

Peek-a-boo! - We use different material to hide our faces while singing peek-a-boo songs to our babies. This session talks about how we can know God.

How Much Love! - We do lots of baby-touch. This session is all about God's love for us.

Splash! We splash around in water and look at lights inside a tent. Here we talk about baptism.

Bubble-talk! - We blow bubbles to our babies and roll beach balls around to each other. We learn about prayer.

Storytime! - Three bible stories are acted out; we get to play with pebbles, sand, material, and toy sheep. This is about reading the bible.

Mission Partners

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Over the next few months I am going to share with you some of the work each of these charities have been undertaking and some ideas of how you can support them in prayer.

This month's charity is:



World Vision help children caught up in emergencies, living in extreme poverty and facing abuse and exploitation.

In 1947 Bob Pierce gave the last \$5 he had in his pocket to care for a Chinese girl that had been abandoned. Bob felt that giving his last \$5 was not enough and that he needed to get more people involved for a long-term solution with more impact so in 1950 he founded World Vision.

World Vision from its beginning in Oregon, USA, focusing on emergencies in East Asia, is now working in nearly 100 countries worldwide and is the largest Christian international non-governmental organisation.

Their focus is on helping the most vulnerable children in the most difficult places overcome poverty and experience a full life. Inspired by their Christian faith they help children of all faiths, and none. They believe to make happy and fulfilling childhoods takes the whole community and they work with the whole community to achieve this.

They tackle poverty at its roots and work with communities to ensure long term change, so progress continues after they leave. Their integrated approach includes clean water, healthcare, education, child protection, and income generation.

Their aim is to allow every child to fulfil their God-given potential.

The work of World Vision can be supported by sponsoring a child or buying a charity gift as a present that will help others. Over a number of years, we as a church have supported World Vision by donating money, saved by not sending each other Christmas cards, to buy coats and blankets for vulnerable children.

Here are some things that you can pray for:

- Pray for Children in Syria, who have been caught up in the war there. Pray for peace and for the children's suffering to end.
- Pray for Children in South Sudan were 6 million people are facing extreme hunger.
- Pray for Rohingya Children refugees. Pray for safety and peace.






Happy & Sad Prayers

You might find that you're spending more time inside as we head into the colder weather and darker evenings, here's an activity for families that gives lots of opportunity for chatting and connecting to lead you into a time of prayer.

Paper Plate Faces – You'll need a paper plate or circle of card for each member of the family. Spend time together creating a happy face on one side and a sad face on the other side of your plates.

You could use wool for hair, googly eyes, material or pipe cleaners for the mouth and nose or simply draw and colour the face features. You could even make your faces a self-portrait!

Don't forget to make one side happy and the other side sad.





Chat together

Look at your happy faces together, talk about all the things that make you happy - make sure everyone has a turn at speaking, you might want to write down some or all of the things you talk about.

Now look at your sad faces together, talk about some of the things that make you sad, again making sure everyone has a turn. You could write down these things on a different piece of paper.

You could even write some of the happy and sad things onto each side of the face.

Now Pray...

Look at your happy list or remember some of the things that you all said. Hold your paper plate faces happy side up as you pray, you could say;

God, thank you for all these wonderful things that make us happy, and then list some of the things – everyone could say something from their list and thank God for it.



Then look at your sad list or remember some of the things you all said. Hold your paper plate faces sad side up as you ask God for help, you could say;

God, these things make us sad, tell God what they are, then ask Him to help or to show you how you

If it's possible, sit quietly for a few moments together and see if you feel God saying anything back to you.

A massive thank you

This is a quick note to say a massive thank you for your donation of food to the Food Project. We have been absolutely astounded by the generosity of so many and we want to pass on the thanks from those who receive the food parcels.

As you are probably aware the need is great and we are seeking to support people in our area. We have 7 centres in Rothley, Birstall, Mountsorrel, Barrow, Sileby, Thurmaston and Syston and are giving out over 40 food parcels per week. In the last year we have given out 2,400 food parcels which is triple the amount we gave out in the year before Covid.

As well as giving out food we also encourage people to come in and have a chat over a drink and biscuit. We seek to get alongside those we support, to understand the challenges they face and to help them to a better future through direct help or sign posting to other services.

We also operate Soar Valley Community Money Advice which helps people struggling with debts. This has got much busier in the last few months as the restrictions for the pandemic have been lifted.

We expect the need to increase further in the next few months so your generous donation will help us meet that need. We are so humbled that you have been able to donate food and we give you our grateful thanks.
