The Church has worked hard to ensure that our meeting places are safe spaces for people to gather and worship is a good environment for improving our mental health as we turn from looking at our own troubles and seeing the goodness of God.

The writer to the Hebrews reminds us that we should not give up meeting together, but encourage each other to do so more and more for in doing so we spur one another on toward love and good deeds.

Mission Partners

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Over the next few months I am going to share with you some of the work each of these charities have been undertaking and some ideas of how you can support them in prayer.

This month's charity is:



The Church Mission Society (CMS) was founded on the 12th April 1799 in Aldersgate Street, London. The founders, which included William Wilberforce, came from the Clapham Sect, which was a group of activist evangelical Christians. They were committed to three great enterprises: abolition of the slave trade, social reform at home and world evangelisation.

It's overseas mission work began in 1804 in Sierra Leone and then spread to India, Canada, New Zealand and around the Mediterranean. Currently there are CMS people in 40 countries across Africa, Asia, South America, The Middle East, Europe and here at home in the UK. People from all walks of life are part of the CMS family and although they come from diverse backgrounds they are united in their commitment to God's mission.

One example of their work is ReVive. This is a charity set up by CMS mission partners in Olinda, north-east Brazil to provide a home and protection for abused and vulnerable girls. They currently run two homes and support over seventy-five girls with accommodation, protection and education.

ReVive has just been given permission by the local authorities to start a fostering service, the first of its kind in the area.

CMS believes that every Christian – and ultimately every person – is called to join in God's mission and has the potential to bring challenge, change, hope and freedom to the world.

Here are some prayer ideas:

- Pray for the ReVive charity in Brazil as it seeks foster parents for its new initiative.
- Pray for H's work amongst the women & girls trapped in Thailand's sex trade.
- Pray for CMS Mission partners around the world.
- Pray for CMS role in training leaders in churches around the world.

This is why




I hope you got some fantastic presents this Christmas!
