

Thoughts for Lent

I am reminded by the adverts for a certain squeezy lemon, that pancake day is upon us once more (1st March in case you've missed it) and the countdown towards Easter has begun. Of course pancake day is the day before the start of Lent when the Church enters a period of solemn preparation for Easter. Traditionally the cries of 'Hallelujah' are silenced until we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter morning. We are encouraged to think about our lives, our lifestyle and our worship. It is a time for repentance and reshaping of our priorities and focus.

I thought this would be a good opportunity to share with you my vision of how Church life should be so that we can journey together to make our Church just a little more Christ-like. I can sum it up in three words: Up - In - Out; but I suspect these need a little more explanation.



UP – This is to do with our relationship with God. The upward focus reminds us to deepen our faith, to develop our discipleship, to pray, to read the Bible, to spend time studying and learning. It is as we look up towards a Holy God, that we become aware of our faults and unholiness. We say sorry and try to live lives that are more pleasing to God. In the language of our Diocesan focus, this is about developing the depth of our discipleship.

IN – This is to do with our relationship with one another. The Inward focus reminds us to develop our fellowship with other believers, to attend Church, to meet and pray with and for others in the Church family. This is where we build deep and loving friendships and nurture one another in faith. It finds its true meaning as we gather around the communion table meeting God and one another in bread and wine. In the language of our Diocesan focus, this is about developing the number of disciples.

OUT — This is to do with our relationship with the community. The Outward focus reminds us that we live as Christians within society. Recognising that we have received blessing upon blessing from God, we reach out with his love into the wider community to share something of God's blessing. We serve others without paying any attention to faith, gender, race, sexuality, (dis)ability, wealth or poverty or any other label. In doing so, we hope that some may come to know God's love and turn to him in faith; but we continue to serve whether this happens or not. In the language of our Diocesan focus, this is about showing loving service to the world.

As you journey through Lent towards Easter, may I encourage you to consider how balanced your Christian faith is with regard to these three aspects. If we can do one thing this Lent, let it be to balance our Christian lives to give equal regard to God, one another and the wider world.

If there were a Bible passage that sums this up well, I think Acts 2.42-47 is pretty close:

⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Lent Project 2022

Every year we're faced with the question – 'What should we support for the Lent Project this year?' It can be quite a task finding a project, checking the organisation is responsible with the money they receive and coming up with ways of inspiring everyone to give.

This year, with our current economic situation in the UK the answer seems more obvious and closer to home.

With millions of people expected to struggle with the increasing cost of living, energy and fuel, we have chosen this year to support the Soar Valley Community Food Project.



'All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had'. (Acts 4:32)

To support the project, we hope to collect food and money donations throughout Lent from our churches and Christchurch & St Peter's Primary School. The food is distributed to those in need across the Soar Valley and money donations will be particularly helpful to the projects gas & electricity top up scheme which is vital to many families at this time — no one should have to choose between food and heating/power and the Soar Valley Food Project can help to ensure this won't happen in our community.

Please particularly donate the following items

Tinned meals e.g. Chicken in sauce, or beef and onion.

Tinned meat e.g. spam or corned beef Tinned custard and rice pudding

Tinned fruit e.g. pineapple, peach or fruit cocktail

Tinned macaroni cheese, spaghetti or ravioli

Tinned vegetables e.g. carrots, peas or corn Tinned baked beans

Packet rice

Jam - Strawberry or raspberry Squash - orange or blackcurrant Food donations can be placed in the basket at the back of Christ Church or St Peter's Church or in the box outside the Vicarage.

Donations of money can be paid by card using the Sumup facility or placed in the bowls marked 'Soar Valley Food Project Lent Appeal'. These will be available in both churches throughout Lent.

There is a collecting box near the main Church door.

Using the big screen for singing time (with noisy musical instruments of course!) has been well received and meant we could include Mr Tumble as well as puppets singing our Christian songs!

We're currently serving over 30 families, it's amazing fun and a brilliant ministry to families.
