Lord, teach us to pray...

One of the joys of being a parent is preparing your child(ren) for adulthood; helping them to take their place as independent adults in wider society. This often involves passing on skills that we, as adults, have begun to take for granted - such as cooking a decent meal, using the washing machine, learning to drive... the list is almost endless. Some of these 'life lessons' are taught by example and others

through deliberate teaching and practice. And surely there can be no greater joy than when a child comes to you and asks, "Can you teach me to do that?"

In the scriptures, we see a similar approach with Jesus and his disciples. They follow him everywhere and carefully watch him to learn from his example and teaching. In Luke's gospel, chapter 11, we read that Jesus was praying in a certain place and when he had finished, one of his disciples came to him and said, "Lord, teach us to pray." And from this simple request, Jesus instructs them in a pattern of prayer that we still use in all of our services today – The Lord's Prayer.

These words, have altered little over the centuries and still have the power to bring us to our knees in acknowledgement of who God is, his power to provide for our needs and to forgive our failings.

In the period between Ascension Day (26th May) and Pentecost (5th June) that we now call 'Thy Kingdom Come' we are encouraged to come back to these words of Jesus and pray for the Church, the world and particularly to bring to mind the names of five people who do not yet know the love of God for themselves. In our prayers, we remember them and pray that God's kingdom would come into their lives.

Who will you be praying for? What situations in the world will you offer to God? What are your prayers for the Church? In all of them, will you join with me in praying 'Thy Kingdom Come'?

Dorothy was in Brazil as part of a team of Bible Translators but was able to use her skills in nursing and midwifery for the benefit of the local people.

Dorothy particularly wanted to share the following with us.

17th Century Nun's Prayer

Lord thou knowest better than I know myself that I am growing older and will some day be old. Keep me from the fatal habit of thinking I must say something on every occasion. Release me from craving to straighten out everybody's affairs.

Make me thoughtful but not moody: helpful but not bossy. With my vast store of wisdom, it seems a pity not to use it all, but thou knowest Lord that I want a few friends at the end.

Keep my mind free from the recital of endless details; give me wings to get to the point.

Seal my lips on my aches and pains. They are increasing and love of rehearsing them is becoming sweeter as the years go by.

I dare not ask for improved memory, but for a growing humility and a lessing cocksureness where my memory seems to clash with the memories of others. Teach me the glorious lesson, that occasionally I may be mistaken.

Keep me reasonably sweet; I do not want to be a saint – some of them are so hard to live with – but a sour old person is one of the crowning works of the devil.

Give me the ability to see good things in unexpected places, and talents in unexpected people. And give me the grace to tell them so.

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support and pray for a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Please find some prayer pointers to help us to pray for global issues and the Charites we support and their work throughout the world:

Ukraine Conflict:

- Pray for vulnerable people who are unable to flee the conflict; e.g. the elderly or those with disabilities.
- Pray for provision of essential supplies; food, clean water, power.
- Pray that refugees will find safe places to stay and will not be exploited.
- Pray for those in our Diocese who are looking at how we as a community can support refugees here in Leicester.
- Pray for those who have lost loved ones on both sides of the conflict.
- Pray for all the charities working in Ukraine and neighbouring countries.

Open Doors:

- Pray for the school girls kidnapped from Chibok by Boko Haram in April 2014 that remain in captivity.
- Pray for their families.
- Pray for persecuted women and children throughout the world.

Tear Fund:

- Pray for equality of provision across the world, that no one goes hungry.
- Pray for the ongoing peace talks between the government in Chad and armed groups in the country.
- Pray for a restoration of relationships between all groups in Chad.

Church Mission Society:

- Pray for the Christians in Bejaia City, Algeria, were the authorities are campaigning to close churches.
- Pray for the church leaders in Bejaia City to know the comfort of God and the wisdom of the Holy Spirit.
- Pray for all the closed churches in Bejaia City to be reopened and all convicted Christians to be released.

As we all know, this year marks the Platinum Jubilee of our Queen. This is an amazing achievement in itself and one that deserves to be celebrated. Her day of accession was 6th



February 1952 and at our services on 6th February 2022, we marked the beginnings of these celebrations with prayers for Her Majesty. As this day also marked the anniversary of her father, King George VI's death, this was not an appropriate day for celebration and so the nation has held off from its celebrations until the official Jubilee weekend next month.



There will be a long weekend of celebrations beginning on Thursday 2nd June with the Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour) and the lighting of Platinum Jubilee Beacons. On Friday 3rd June, there will be a special service of Thanksgiving from St Paul's Cathedral which we hope to show in Christ Church as a part of our usual weekly coffee morning. On

Saturday 4th June members of the royal family will attend The Derby at Epsom Downs. Later that evening, the BBC will stage and broadcast the Platinum Party at the Palace, a special live concert from Buckingham Palace that will bring together some of the world's biggest entertainment stars to celebrate the most significant and joyous moments from The Queen's seven decade reign.

The majority of us will not be able to attend these events and can only expect to view them from afar. However, the culmination of the weekend's celebrations will be something that we can all join in with. There will be many street parties taking place up and down the land—including here in Mountsorrel. Not everyone lives on a road that is suitable for such a party so we would like to extend an open invitation to all residents of Mountsorrel who are not able to hold their own street party to join us in the gardens of Christ Church to celebrate the Big Jubilee Lunch. We will provide the tables and chairs and a few games & activities; you provide food and drink for yourself and your group. Later in the afternoon, we hope to be able to show the Platinum Pageant on our screen in the Church for those who would like to see it. We extend this invitation so that all of our residents can celebrate this historic moment in a safe environment.
