As I sat beside the fire pit at Muddy Church, I found myself staring into the glowing embers, reflecting on their beauty, observing how the reds and golds flicker and change with flames dancing above and, not for the first time, I was struck with the 'wow' of God. This is what Muddy Church is all about – finding God in the natural world.

Fire is a regular feature in the Bible. In fact the word fire-s appears four hundred and sixty-

four times. It's use is varied, but here are some of the uses.

- **Fire.** Sometimes it is just that. A fire, for cooking or keeping warm.
- **God's presence.** God appeared to Moses from the fire of a burning bush.
- **Sacrifice.** Abraham was prepared to offer his son Isaac as a burnt offering in the fire. The Israelites made burnt offerings, sin offerings, fellowship offerings to God offerings made by fire.
- **Guidance.** God guided the Israelites through the desert with a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night.
- **Cleansing.** Pots, pans and other objects that had become 'unclean' were cleansed by being put through fire.
- **Judgement.** Elijah called down fire upon the men of King Ahaziah of Samaria because the King wanted to consult another god instead of Israel's God, the Lord.
- Love. Solomon describes love as a fire that blazes like a mighty flame.
- **Punishment.** Often, after taking over a city and destroying or capturing the inhabitants, an invading army would set the city on fire so there was nowhere for them to return to.
- Place of Reconciliation. After his resurrection, Jesus met with Peter on the beach with a fish barbecue. As they chatted, Jesus offered his forgiveness for the three times that Peter had denied him, by asking Peter to affirm his love for Jesus and by Jesus calling him into future ministry.

and perhaps the most well known of all:

• **Hell.** A place to be avoided at all costs. A place of eternal fire. A lake of fire. A place without Good and without God.

I hope that this Summer brings you warmth – but not so much that you think you're in hell.



Prayer Ideas

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support and pray for a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Please find some prayer pointers to help us to pray for global issues and the Charites we support and their work throughout the world:

Leprosy Mission:

- Pray for their work in Myanmar, especially their work with the government and other organisations to break down the barriers to inclusion for people with disabilities.
- Pray for protection from harm and illness for Dr Zaw Moe Aung and his team as they support those living with the effects of leprosy.
- Pray for them as they work with rural communities to raise awareness of leprosy, improve sanitation and set up hydropower to bring light to dark homes.
- Pray for God's blessing on the Disability Resource Centres across Myanmar. These centres provide rehabilitation, physiotherapy, ulcer care and counselling to people living in the local areas.
- Pray for protection for the people of Myanmar, wisdom for the government leaders and for peace across the country.

Compassion:

- Pray for the ending of child marriage (girls under 18) around the world.
- Pray protection over vulnerable girls whose families may be thinking of marrying them off young due to poverty.
- Pray for the child marriage prevention workshops in Bangladesh.
- Pray for Compassion team members working around the world to protect children and educate communities about the harm of child marriages.

Tear Fund:

- Pray for the people of Haiti where gang warfare has broken out.
- Pray for the children who are unable to attend school because of the violence. Pray that ways will be found to enable them to continue their studies.
- Pray that children are not recruited into the gangs.
- Pray for the Tear fund team providing conflict resolution training to church leaders.
- Pray that those leaders taking part, that they will be able to instigate community dialogue with the gang members and bring about healing, restoration and peace.

Mountsorrel:

- Pray for all those in our community who are struggling due to the rising cost of living.
- Pray for the Mountsorrel Community Food Project and all who volunteer there.
- As the school holidays begin this month pray for all families and especially those who will be worried about how they are going to feed their children.




There's Dirt On My Shirt

Christ Church - Update Are you wondering what is happening on the roof?



The stone coping on the gable end at the chancel end is delaminating which means that pieces are falling off.

A set of photos are on the noticeboards in church showing that there is no drip channel on the roof side of the gable.





This resulted in water creeping back under the coping causing it to become saturated and prone to damage by frost. Roots of plants have been seen under the coping, having followed the water.

All the coping on this gable is being replaced with new stone which has had to be cut specifically for our gable. The new stone has a drip channel on both sides!

Please will you sponsor me as I attempt a walk in Scotland?



I have set my heart on doing a 6 ½ mile walk (really a climb), in order to funds raise for **CMT** (Charcot Marie Tooth disease). It's а disease which attacks the peripheral nerves. SO basically, your muscles are wasting away.

Some of you will know that Graham endured this disease for many years.

After attending a specialist hospital in Canada, an expert there suggested CMT. Back home, the medics weren't even aware of it ignoring the suggestion for a further eight years. Once the diagnosis was made known to us, by then aged 62 years, the symptoms over so many years all made sense. You can read about CMT on their website https://www.cmt.org.uk

I tried climbing Conic Hill last year, but only made it as far as the plateau. This being a great disappointment to me, I believe that with sponsorship as an incentive, I will make it to the summit. Eight years having passed by this July, I now feel able to raise some funds for CMT to help further their research. Our eldest son Gavin, has agreed to come with me. The actual day is as yet unknown, but definitely during the third week of July.

Conic Hill stands 361 metres (1,184 feet high) and is part of a major geological feature known as the Highland Boundary Fault. This forms a zone separating the Lowlands to the south from the Highlands to the north, each with different rock types, landscapes, animal and plant life and cultural heritage. I'm told that there are wonderful views from the top....even part way up, they were worth seeing!


