Doing my duty for God and the Queen

Many years ago, just after my eighth birthday I attended my first ever Cub Scout meeting. Not long after that, I made a promise to do my best to do my duty to God and to the Queen. A promise that was repeated and renewed



at my investiture as a Scout, Venture Scout, Scout Leader, and every year at the St George's day parade and at every investiture of a new Scout, Venture Scout or Scout Leader that I witnessed. As a Queen's Scout (although no longer an active member of the Scout Association) I still try to hold to that promise. Now, following the death of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, one element of that promise has come to an end.

In his sermon during the Queen's funeral, and drawing from the text of the first reading from 1 Corinthians 15, the Archbishop of Canterbury reminded us that all things temporal must come to an end and be replaced by things eternal. My promise to do my duty to the Queen has been completed. If I were to become an active member of the Scouts once again, my promise would reference the King, but until that time, what is temporal has come to an end and I am left with the eternal – a promise to do my duty to God.


For me, doing my duty to God means doing my best to be the best disciple of Jesus Christ that I can be. To take note of his words as recorded in Scripture, his guidance, his instruction and to follow him wholeheartedly throughout my life. What does this look like? Well I guess it is best summed up in the words of Jesus when he was asked which is the greatest commandment. Jesus replied to his questioner with these words,

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.' (Matthew 22.37-40).

This is what following Jesus looks like for me. What does it look like for you? Why not let me know.

Church Missionary Society:

- Pray for the elections in Brazil on October 2nd for a new President, Vice-President and National Congress. Pray that they are peaceful and for a clear result accepted by all.
- Pray for CMS Mission Partners working to re-open the historic Anglican Church in Jaffa, Israel.
- Pray for Pakistan amid the ongoing devastating flooding. Pray for all those
 who are homeless and affected by water borne diseases. Pray that aid will
 reach the areas where it is most needed.
- Praise God that the school and seminary in Kilimatinde, Tanzania has found water as part of its well project. Please pray that the water is found to be of good quality and certified safe by the government.

We cooked crumpets over the fire and some of us even made our own butter to spread on them!




In September was equally fun as we thought about autumn and change.

Two cinema sessions, the first with popcorn, sweets and drinks for the 5-11s and a pizza and film night for those at secondary school.




For the young we had Story Time with 30 or so babies. Soft play, a Church full of slide, ball pit, ride on toys and happy children everywhere.




Has anybody seen my glasses?


