### Remembrance

As we move into November we are entering a period of Remembrance.

It starts with All Saints Day on November 1<sup>st</sup>. This is the day that we especially remember all the saints and martyrs, known and unknown throughout Christian history. We will be marking the day with a service of Holy Communion (BCP) at St. Peter's Church at 7pm.



This is followed by All Souls Day on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. This is a day dedicated to remembering the faithfully departed, we will have the opportunity to remember those who we love but have died at a special service on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> October at 4pm at Christ Church.

Then on November 11<sup>th</sup>, Armistice Day, we remember all those who have lost their lives in both World Wars and all conflicts since. There will be a special service of Remembrance with the Royal British legion at 3pm on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November at St. Peter's Church.

Remembrance is a central part of life, it is something that unites us. On a personal level we remember family and friends that have died and as a community we honour those who lost their lives in protecting our country and way of life.

In the Old Testament the Jews were told by God to remember their deliverance from Egypt; "This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD - a lasting ordinance" Genesis 12:14.

For us as Christians, remembrance is at the very heart of our worship for every time we share communion we are remembering what Jesus did for us.

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." I Corinthians 11: 23-25.

There's lots of opportunity to chat and talk about topics like birth stories, sleeping, weaning & eating, going back to work and how you are feeling.

### We also gently wonder about some of life's big questions, each session has a theme;

**Peek-a-boo!** - We use different material to hide our faces while singing peek-a-boo songs to our babies. This session talks about how we can know God.

**How Much Love!** - We do lots of baby-touch. This session talks about God's love for us. **Splash!** We splash around in water and look at lights inside a tent. Here we talk about baptism.

**Bubble-talk!** - We blow bubbles to our babies and roll beach balls around to each other as we wonder about prayer.

**Storytime!** We retell 3 bible stories; we get to play with pebbles, sand, material and toy sheep. This is about reading the bible
