Preparation, Anticipation and Celebration

As we leave November and move into December we leave behind a time of Remembrance and move into a time of Preparation and Anticipation that leads us into a time of Celebration.

On Sunday 27th November Advent began, which is the start of the Christian year. Advent means "Coming" and is a time of preparation like Lent. When Advent was first introduced in the fourth and fifth centuries it also lasted 40 days, subsequently it was reduced to just the period incorporating the four Sunday's leading up to Christmas Day.

During Advent we prepare for the celebration of Christmas. This preparation usually incorporates shopping for presents and food, sending cards, attending Nativity and Carol services. During Advent we also look forward with anticipation to celebrating Christmas with family and friends.

Advent as well as a time of practical preparation should also be a time of spiritual preparation where we make time to reflect on the true meaning of that first Christmas, that Jesus willingly gave up everything to be born as a helpless baby knowing it would result in his death, so that we could be reconciled with God and have eternal life.

As well as a time of spiritual preparation Advent is a time of spiritual anticipation, where we look forward to the second coming of Christ and all that means for us, "so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will appear a second time, not to bear sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him"

Hebrews 9:28.

This all leads us into a time of Celebration, a celebration of what happened that first Christmas, a celebration of what God has done for us and what he has promised to all that follow him.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.

John 3: 16-17.

We demonstrated some good teamwork like the four friends who carried the man to Jesus and wondered why Jesus had forgiven the man before healing him. My belief on this is simple; Jesus knew what this man needed and therefore healing him without saying he was forgiven would have left an unmet need in the man.

Our prayers were more formal this month, but as we prayed for the world, our community, and those who are unwell or suffering, we brought forward biblical style stretchers with a representation of our prayers.


