Happy New Year

When I was deliberating on what sort of greeting to bring to this edition of Church News, I came across some advice from a blog called paperlesspost that suggested,

"stick with a festive message that is general enough to appeal to anyone. These blurbs are simple and straightforward, while still being thoughtful: Health and happiness to you and yours in the new year ahead; Warmest Wishes; Out with the old, in with the new. Happy New Year!; Peace love and happiness; Cheers to new beginnings; Have a joyful new year. Peace & Love."

All of which, now that I have shared them with you, would come with very little thought.

It is a new year and, as always, it gives the perfect opportunity to look back and reflect on the months that have past and look forward to the year that is coming. Of course, the older you get, the more you realise, that although the date changes, nothing much else will. For most of us, life will continue along much the same path as before. We will see both good times and not-so-good times in 2023. For one, I hope not to need emergency surgery. But whatever life throws at you, it is how we deal with it that is important.

For example, when I was in hospital at the end of October finding myself confronted with the 'non-choice' of surgery or paralysis, I could have panicked and been fearful. Yet I chose to trust in both the NHS and in God who had given skills and talents to the surgical team that were to look after me. Throughout the whole process, I found a trust and a faith that sustained me in peace. Even now as my recovery continues, I trust that God will be everpresent so that whatever the outcomes are, all will be well. Of course, as a Christian, I know that even death is not the end, it simply brings on a new beginning. Jesus said, 'My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand.' (John 10.27-28).

So, yes there will be new opportunities in 2023, and I hope that, for all of us, it turns out to be our best year yet. But, as for what greeting to give you, I don't think I can beat that of the Old testament priestly blessing:

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face towards you and give you peace."

(Numbers 6.24-26)
