God's love is for all the people

When For several decades, the Church of England has been exploring and debating issues around identity, sexuality, relationships and marriage. The last six years in particular have seen the Church engage in a process of listening and learning together around these issues under the heading of Living in Love and Faith. This is a process that we have engaged with in our own parish and has given individuals the opportunity to give feedback into the debates. Generally, these issues tend to polarise views within the Church around matters of doctrine with some calling for the Church to take a fresh interpretation of the Bible that would allow us to extend the offer of marriage to those in same-sex relationships; while others are calling on the Church to uphold a traditional view of sexuality and marriage. The discussions have not been easy; and, at times, hurtful words have been spoken on both sides of the debate.

Alongside proposals to be debated at General Synod this month, the House of Bishops has now issued a direct apology to LGBTQI+ people for the way the Church has rejected them, admitting "We have not loved you as God loves you, and that is profoundly wrong." The proposals, which you can find on the Church of England website, recognise that there is still much disagreement on the way forward. For some, the proposals will go too far; yet for others, the proposals will not go far enough. I am not sure how the debate at General Synod will pan out, but there is the danger that neither side of the debate will be satisfied and the motion will fall.

Penny Mordaunt, MP has said, "This issue [same-sex marriage] has been under discussion within the Church of England for a long time... I fear if it is not resolved at General Synod the matter will continue to fester and detract from the positive contribution the Church of England makes to our society." This is a real danger – that the focus of the Church shifts from worship and the outward looking sharing of God's love to an inward focus of argument and doctrine.

So whatever you see of the Church in the press over the coming weeks, I want to reassure you that I will continue to focus on the needs of my parishes and the sharing of God's love to ALL the people of our community. It is my hope and prayer that our Church family will do the same. Perhaps it is no coincidence that we begin February with a remembrance that Jesus Christ was presented in the temple and proclaimed to be 'salvation prepared in the sight of all people; a light for revelation to the gentiles (non-jews) and the glory of Israel.' (See Luke 2.29-32)

Please join with me in praying for the members of General Synod who will debate these proposals on 8th February.



Lent Project 2023 Acts of Random Kindness!

This year, our Lent Project is all about spreading love and kindness! Christchurch & St Peter's Primary School will also be joining us in this project.

We've chosen a theme for each week and will be encouraging the school children, staff and all our church congregations to take part in acts of random kindness throughout Lent. It could be as simple as smiling at someone, letting someone merge in front of you in queuing traffic, making something for someone, donating to the food bank or helping someone for nothing in return.



If you want to follow the themes as the children do, here they are...

- 1.Helping at home
- 2.Helping others
- 3.Kind words
- 4.Support a charity
- 5.Be kind to yourself

There's lots and lots of things we can all do to make a difference to other people with our kindness. It might mean giving up some time or being generous with what we have some weeks which is all very appropriate throughout Lent.

By the beginning of Lent there will be a display in each of our churches for our Lent project, along with some post-it heart stickers. Each time you come into church, stick a heart post-it onto the display for each time kindness has been shown to you and for each act of random kindness you have made. You don't need to write anything on the hearts, just stick them on to show that kindness has been shown. We hope to have 2 displays full of hearts by the end of Lent!

Prayer Ideas

Pray for the church:

- That the church in Ukraine, Russia and the wider region will be a voice for peace.
- That's God's power will be revealed through the church bringing a message of love and hope in the midst of darkness.

Pray for Global impact:

- For food and fuel prices to stabilise.
- That provision will be made for countries in vulnerable positions.

Pray for Peace:

- That there will be an immediate end to the violence.
- That diplomatic solutions will be found that will lead to lasting peace.
- That people will be able to return home.
- Strength for individuals and organisations in Ukraine, Russia and the region who are working for peace.





Your support is helping to brighten short lives, across the East Midlands, while ensuring we can continue to be here for children, like Orla.

During a pregnancy scan it was found that Orla had Hydrocephalus - a build-up of fluid on the brain. Now aged three, Orla suffers from frequent seizures, which is a constant worry for her mummy, Laura. Laura recently told us the support she gets from Rainbows is invaluable.

"We were put in touch with Rainbows right at the beginning as they sourced a special car seat, that enabled Orla to lie down, to transport her home from hospital," said Laura.

"Rainbows helped out right from the start. They helped us to leave hospital and they are still part of our story now.

"When I first looked around I was really nervous and didn't know what to expect. I thought it would be a really sad place. But it was amazing. The staff go above and beyond and look after the whole family, which is lovely."




