#### **Not Everything is Better Online**

Many things that used to take time to achieve can now be accomplished online in a fraction of the time. For example, I recently applied to renew my passport. The process was incredibly simple, completed with a photo taken on my mobile phone. There was no need to queue at the post office to get the correct form, no need to talk to anyone, no need to wait for the photo-booth to process and print my photo, no need to find someone to countersign the photo, no need to get the form double-checked at the post office. It was, in short, a very simple process.

Even the art of letter writing has taken on new levels with the introduction of AI (artificial intelligence) Chat Bots. Have you ever wondered what this letter might look like if produced by a ChatBot? Well, apparently, something like this:

[As we approach the month of April, we are reminded of the significance of this time in the Christian calendar. April is the month of Easter, and it culminates with the celebration of Resurrection Sunday on April 16th. We are excited to celebrate the hope and promise of new life that this day represents. We invite you to join us for our special Resurrection Sunday service on April 16th at [time]. We will have a powerful message of hope and joy, as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.]

It begins so well, but then it is obvious that the ChatBot can't distinguish between our date of Easter and that of the Orthodox Church; and it doesn't spell in an English way. Those are minor details, but more importantly it seems to be lacking warmth and connection. You'll probably be pleased to know that I won't be resorting to ChatBots to write my personal message to you each month.

As Church, we are a gathered people. Yes, it is possible to watch a Church service online – and we certainly did our fair chunk of that during the Covid lockdown – but it is still not the same being present with others as we worship the living God. In Church we sit, stand, kneel, recite our responses, sing, pray, listen, learn, commune and celebrate TOGETHER. We come whether we are feeling happy or sad, when we are sick and when we are well, when life is going well or when it's all gone wrong. Together we gather with fellow disciples of Jesus. We gather because where even two or three are gathered together,

Jesus promises to be there. We gather because He calls us to do so. And in that place of gathering we find love, healing and acceptance.

So do look at our list of Events and services for this month and join us for some, or all, of them. I can't promise that the Easter Day sermon (on 9th April by the way) will be a 'powerful message of hope and joy'. I hope it is. But I can promise that if we gather, Jesus will be there. Because the good news of Easter – the powerful message of hope and joy, if you like – is that Jesus is alive.

# **Chrism Eucharist**

Diocesan ('Chrism') Eucharist on Maundy Thursday 6 April 2023 at 11am at St James the Greater, London Road, Leicester LE2 1NE.

We very much look forward to seeing you on Maundy Thursday as deacons, priests and bishops as we gather to renew our ordination vows. This service is open to anyone, so please do extend a warm welcome to others, including church officers and lay ministers.

This service provides the opportunity for us to express something of what it means to be 'The Diocese' as we come together before God as members of the body of Christ, and it is my expectation and hope that all licensed clergy will be present (while being aware that a midweek morning is not an easy time for chaplains and those in secular employment). Clergy with PTO are also very welcome to attend.

In this service, we are affirming our relationship to one another as ordained ministers, so I would be glad if you would all robe, as we express our solidarity with one another. Robing will be in the Under Croft of St James the Greater. The 'dress code' is alb and white stole, but cassock, surplice and scarf are also acceptable. All Readers are welcome to attend and robe in cassock, surplice and blue scarf. Please make sure you are robed by 10.40am at the latest.

During this service, we will also bless the oils for use in ordination, initiation and healing. Oils will be available for collection in the church after the service so please bring empty, suitable containers with you.

# **News From the Church Councils**

At a joint meeting of the Church Councils of both Christ Church and St Peter's Church, we decided that we would like to raise some funds for two particular situations.

First, most of you will be aware that Mel Rowley has been training to be an Associate Minister in the Church of England. She has now finished her training and is due to be licensed for her work in our parishes by the Bishop during a special service on 20<sup>th</sup> May at St Margaret's Church, Leicester beginning at 3pm. Everyone is invited to attend the service and show her our support. We would like to give Mel a set of robes to wear for funerals, for services at St Peter's and on other formal occasions. Secondly, Our Children & Family Workers and our Youth Workers have explored the possibility of purchasing some computer tablets for use with some Augmented Reality software produced by Missional Generation in conjunction with New Wine. Young people today are used to receiving information digitally and the software that we've seen will allow

them to experience God's word in ways that are familiar to them whilst also helping them on their spiritual journey. The equipment and software will cost in the region of £1,500 and we are looking for donations to help pay for it. 

Join us for a short interactive service suitable for all ages to mark Good Friday. We will hear the story, sing a song, join in a prayer activity and make our Easter garden.






# An Hour Before The Cross
