

Long live the king!

The coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May will be a unique occasion. We have never had such a long time between the successive coronations of a British monarch. What will make this event unique is the fact that most of those taking part in the proceedings were not alive when the last one took place. Memories of those who were witnesses to our late Queen's coronation have begun to fade and the details are, perhaps, a little short on the actual details.

And so, the rite is renewed afresh for our generation. The new king will have his say, the Archbishop of Canterbury his; other officials will add their two penn'orth. Of course the media will want a say too. Out of it all will arise a ceremony that will be unique to our king and our generation.

St Paul, writing to the Roman Church, reminds us that all earthly authorities — yes even the bad ones (this is more trickier to explain and may require an entire theological tome to be written) — have been established by God. Here's how he put it:

"Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves." Romans 13.1-2

When the Israelites settled in the promised land, they asked Samuel the prophet to appoint a king to rule over them. This request was distressing to Samuel, because in asking for a king, they were rejecting God as their King: "But when they said, 'Give us a king to lead us,' this displeased Samuel; so he prayed to the Lord. And the Lord told him: 'Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king." 1 Samuel 8.6-7

So, King Charles III will be crowned king on 6th May, but let us not, in celebrating with him, reject the Lord our God as King of kings and Lord of Lords. Let us follow the advice of Jesus and "render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." Matthew 22.21

YOUTH WORK

Faith expressing itself through love is an expression found in Galations 5:6, where Paul tells us that it is the only thing that counts when we choose to live by the direction and power of the Spirit. The way in which we live our lives is an act of worship in itself; serving, encouraging, giving generously and showing mercy are all ways in which we can offer our lives to God, and express our faith.

The Message version of Romans 12:1-2 sums this up really nicely

"So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."

The idea of offering our everyday activities as part of worship is the motivation for our mid week youth group, where we hope to demonstrate our faith in action to the young people in our community who may have no other contact with the church or to God. We want them to see church as not just a safe place, but as a place full of love for all of God's people. With this in mind, we are looking for volunteers to support us as we come alongside our young people. Please do prayerfully reflect on whether you could offer a few hours a month to serve, encourage and show the Love of Jesus to our youth.


