CH__CH-What's missing?

The English language is a complicated thing. Seeing first-hand the experience of Ukrainian refugees trying to learn the language has brought this home to me. Words that sound the same have different spellings and meanings; and other words that have identical spelling have alternative definitions, and sometimes pronunciation, depending on the context. I am sure that most, if not all, languages have similar anomalies as these.

One English word that is difficult to define is the word 'Church'. Its meaning varies according to the context in which it is used, and even then it may not always be clear what is meant by the speaker.

Church can simply mean a building for Christian worship – the Church is at the other end of the village. Church can also be defined as an occupation or ministry of the ordained clergy – What made you join the Church? (For some reason I can't explain in a few short words, it's not a phrase that I am comfortable with.) The word Church can also be used to define the global collective of all Christian believers – We are part of the Church.

The word Church(es) appears 114 times in the New Testament and with very few exceptions, the Greek word (the New Testament was originally written in Greek) used is ekklesia which is also sometimes translated as assembly or congregation. It is also closely related to the words which mean broken off, alienate, exclude. Which brings me, perhaps, to a greater understanding of how I would use the word Church.

Church is a community of Christian believers who gather together to worship the living God. We are 'called apart' to live according to a different standard, following the commands of Jesus, who calls us to be holy. In some parts of the world, this 'calling apart' is more of a 'thrusting away' as Christians face persecution by their families and communities. For most of us in the UK, it is a separating ourselves from the temptations of the world to live as God calls us to. St Peter puts it like this: "You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." (1 Peter 2.9).

I wonder if you would like to be part of this amazing body of people. Why not join us as we worship God together .






Young Away Day
