What Makes a strong team?

If you are the sort of person who switches off at the first mention of football, please skip over the next paragraph. If you don't like mixed metaphors, this whole page will probably annoy you – please accept my apology now.

This year's football summer transfer window ran from 14 June to 1 September. While most of us were concerned with getting a few days holiday, players, lawyers, coaches, managers, boards were working hard to get the best deal possible. Some 750 players within the Championship and Premier Leagues transferred in this period at fees ranging anything from zero to an obscene £105m for Declan Rice moving from West Ham United to Arsenal.

You don't have to be a sports fan to know that a good player on the team makes all the difference to your chances of success. But a good team is more than just the individual players. A good team includes everyone from the players, coaches and managers to the back-room support staff and even the fans. But why, when I really don't care that much for football, am I talking about this now? Because I think, if I stretch the analogy, there are some parallels between a sports team and the Church of England. Here's just a couple:

- 1) The whole Church is only the whole Church when every member does their part. St Paul uses the analogy of a body in 1 Corinthians 12.12-27 "The body is not made up of one part but of many... you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it."
- We work together so that the strong support the weak. A good team will often see stronger members carrying others in their time of weakness. The Church of England does this through its parish, benefice, deanery and diocesan structures and the pooling of shared resources.

Our Church has now been invited to join local conversations with other churches in this area to see how we might work better together in structures that the Diocese of Leicester is calling Minster Communities. This is an exciting time for us and some of the suggested changes to how we work may lead to increased levels of concern and anxiety for some; but working together is a God idea. God lives in Trinity as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I would suggest that when we work together we form a stronger, better team. If you can, join the conversation, pray and watch this space for future developments

Prayer Ideas

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support and pray for a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Please find some prayer pointers to help us to pray for global issues and the Charites we support and their work throughout the world:

Climate Change:

is the leading cause of hunger in the world.

- Pray for farmers around the world who are dealing with the effects of climate change daily.
- Pray for those who have lost crops and livestock due to high temperatures, droughts and floods.
- Pray for all those affected by food insecurity.
- Pray for those who are struggling to afford the rising prices of staple foods.

1.3 billion tons of food is wasted each year which adds to global warming.

- Pray that food manufacturers will find better ways of processing crops and reduce wastage.
- Pray that supermarkets will stop over stocking and will find ways to avoid wastage.
- Pray for initiatives like "Too Good to Go" and "Olio" to become more widely know and used.

Open Doors:

- Pray for the Christian Community in the city of Jaranwala, Pakistan, which was attacked by Muslims in August.
- Pray for those who lost their homes in the attack.
- Pray for the Christians who are in custody, that God will keep them safe, and that all legal proceedings will be conducted without religious bias.
- Pray for Christian families that were separated as they escaped to be reunited.
- Pray for church leadership as they engage with government and Islamic religious leaders.

Church Missionary Society:

- Pray for safety and stamina for CMS people in mission in Ukraine as they
 continue to offer practical help and hope to so many people who are suffering
 by the Sea, the Afternoon Teas and the BBQ.
- Pray for all of the pioneer mission training students who are getting ready to start a new term with CMS this autumn, especially for new students.
- Give thanks that mission associates working in education are back in South Asia at the school they help to lead. Please pray for the ongoing recruitment of additional teachers.

The sessions are baby-centred and include lots of fun activities – singing, storytelling, bathing, baby-touch, and multi-sensory play.

It's also a really great opportunity to build friendships with other mum's or dad's at a similar parenting stage.

There's lots of opportunity to chat and talk about topics like sleeping, weaning & eating, going back to work and how you are feeling.

We also gently wonder about some of life's big questions, each session has a theme;

Peek-a-boo! - We use different material to hide our faces while singing peek-a-boo songs to our babies. This session talks about how we can know God.

How Much Love! - We do lots of baby-touch. This session talks about God's love for us.

Splash! We splash around in water and look at lights inside a tent. Here we talk about baptism.

Bubble-talk! - We blow bubbles to our babies and roll beach balls around to each other as we wonder about prayer.

Story time! We retell 3 bible stories; we get to play with pebbles, sand, material and toy sheep. This is about reading the bible

Do come along and join in, just don't expect everyone to always be singing the same words to the same tune at the same time!






St. Peter's All Age Holy Communion


Once we have finished 'The Villa in Italy' we are having a short break for holidays and half term.
