#### **Time to Pause**

I always find that November is good for taking time to pause. A time to look back and a time to look forward. It is, for me, a time of transition.

November begins with All Saints' Day on the 1st and All Souls' Day on the 2nd of the month. Days set aside in the Christian calendar to give

thanks for those Christian saints who do not have their own special day of remembrance; and for those believers who have gone before us - not necessarily recognised as saints, but nevertheless have left a good example for us to follow.

Remembrance Sunday on the second Sunday of November allows us to remember and give thanks for those we may have never known, yet who gave their lives fighting for the freedoms of others. In our remembrance Sunday services we commit ourselves "to strive for all that makes for peace, to heal the wounds of war and to work for a just future for all humanity". Yet, as I write this missiles are flying over Israel, a ground offensive is underway on the streets of Gaza, lives are being lost in Ukraine and Russia. McCrae's poem 'In Flanders Fields', whilst beautifully poetic, encourages the fight to pass on to the next generation. When will we ever learn?

Yet even as we look back in remembrance, at the same time, the Church calendar encourages us to look to the future as we begin to countdown the Sundays before Advent. The month of November, this season of remembrance, and indeed the Church's year, culminates in the celebration of 'Christ the King' when we remember that in the kingdom of heaven there can only be one King and that King is Jesus Christ. In the collect set for that Sunday, we pray that our Eternal Father may keep the Church in the unity of the Spirit and in the bond of peace, and bring the whole created order to worship at the feet of Jesus Christ who ascended to the throne of heaven to rule over all things as Lord and King .

The second psalm begins by questioning warfare: "Why do the nations conspire and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth rise up and the rulers band together against the Lord..." and concludes by placing God on his throne: "Serve the Lord with fear... blessed are all who take refuge in him".

So, before the chaos and rush of December comes upon us, why don't you, with me, take some extra time this month to pause. Read Psalm 2. Look back in remembrance; reflect on what has been; give thanks. Then look to the future with a renewed hope for all that God has in store for you as you serve him faithfully as a disciple of Christ.

Please find some prayer pointers to help us to pray for global issues and the Charites we support and their work throughout the world:

#### War/Conflict:

- As we lead up to Armistice Day & Remembrance Sunday we remember the
   32 countries where there is currently conflict and its costs; physical,
   emotional and economic.
- Pray for all who are living with physical and emotional wounds due to conflict.
- Pray for all those who are mourning the loss of a loved one.
- Pray for those who have lost their homes, livelihoods and their communities.
- Pray for those who have had to flee their own countries and are now refugees.
- Pray for those who are working to bring peace to the countries affected.
- Pray for all the aid agencies who are working in difficult and dangerous situations.
- Pray for the members of our own armed services and the roles they play across the world in different conflict zones.

#### CMS:

- At Christ Church we are supporting Sarah & Simon who are Mission partners with CMS working in Gulu, Uganda. Sarah is the Principal of the Theological College there and Simon is working with the local Diocese.
- Pray for the ongoing work to apply to the National Council of Higher Education to register the Theological College.
- Pray for the 60 Lay Reader students that they currently have at the college.
- Pray that Simon is able to raise the funds to run the "Rooted in Jesus" conference in January 2024. They are expecting between three and five

- thousand delegates to attend.
- Pray that Sarah & Simon will quickly learn the local language, Acholi.

- Are asking for prayers concerning the worlds urgent rubbish problem; 2

- Pray for the provision of nourishing food and clean water .

We would love you to join us.



# Sunbeams news




Sunbeams have concluded their creation theme. Week by week, we weaved a wonderful story of God imagining and creating and life coming to be.

It's also a really great opportunity to build friendships with other mum's or dad's at a similar parenting stage.

There's lots of opportunity to chat and talk about topics like birth stories, sleeping, weaning & eating, going back to work and how you are feeling.

#### We also gently wonder about some of life's big questions, each session has a theme;

**Peek-a-boo!** - We use different material to hide our faces while singing peek-a-boo songs to our babies. This session talks about how we can know God.

**How Much Love!** - We do lots of baby-touch. This session talks about God's love for us.

**Splash!** We splash around in water and look at lights inside a tent. Here we talk about baptism.
