All through this Lenten period, The Church of England has been offering reflections delivered direct to your email, through an app on your mobile or in printed form.

Under the heading, Watch and Pray, we have been invited to seek God in both familiar and unfamiliar places each day of Lent: in darkness and in quiet; in movement and migration; in

the healing and transforming work of the Spirit; in the weeping of Holy Week and in the joy of Easter morning.

However we journey through Lent — whether we use devotional resources, or not — we are always brought to the place of the cross of Good Friday. We cannot get to Easter morning without first confronting the cross. It is at the cross that we are forced to confront the consequences of sin, the sacrifice of Christ and the reality of death.

When we give consideration to the cross, we cannot do so without first facing up to our sin. However hard we try to live as God intended, we fail. We forget to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength; we fail to love others in the same way we love ourselves. This failing, the Bible calls sin. The cross is a direct result of your sin and mine.

And yet we know that God's love for us is so great that he sent Jesus to be our Saviour. We read in Philippians chapter two that Jesus 'did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!' It is the sacrifice of Christ on the cross that opens the door to our forgiveness.

And yet, we also need to face up to the reality of death. We cannot consider the cross without realising that it was the place of death for Jesus Christ. It should have been us, but Christ took our place becoming the redeeming sacrifice for our sins. As he dies, Jesus declares, 'It is finished!' and so it was.

But death did not have the final word. As we will hear again on Easter morning, Christ conquered death so that 'those who believe in [Jesus], even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in [him] will never die.'

We cannot get to Easter morning without first confronting the cross, but when we do, we discover a greater love for our Saviour that brings hope for us and all people. And that is truly good news worth sharing.





What is it? Who is it for? What do we do?



Muddy Church is an opportunity to spend time outdoors in God's wonderful creation!

It is for everyone, adults and children alike and you can choose to do whatever you enjoy whilst at Muddy Church.

We can use this time to seek God in creation and wonder about all the amazing things we see; from watching tiny bugs scurrying around to thinking about the trees - how long they have stood there, how they renew their leaves each year, the systems they use to take in water, all the while remembering that this is all part of God's creation, His design for earth.

We can take our shoes off, feel the ground underneath our feet and wonder why did God make grass? And why spikey thistles!

We can watch the clouds making shapes in the sky, count the birds, wander around the area or simply sit and chat about our lives around the fire in fellowship with one another. As we chat, we can wonder about the question for the session on our new chalk board or we can ask our own questions like – if wasps have no use on earth, why did God make them?

We can imagine we are somewhere else – wondering what it was like to be different people in the bible; a shepherd watching sheep, the disciples as the risen Jesus cooked breakfast on the beach, Peter warming himself by the fire denying he knew Jesus, Moses at the burning bush – how might we have felt in these different situations?

We can sometimes hear a story or sing around the fire and we can definitely always cook something over the fire even if it's just toasting a marshmallow!

We can go bug hunting, play hide 'n' seek, build shelters, measure a worm, play in the mud kitchen, mix natural potions, create something from natural materials, join in a nature activity or just explore the area.

Spending time outdoors is proven to be brilliant for our mental health and for me, it definitely has an impact on my spiritual well-being; there is something about just being in creation that brings me close to God and reminds me just who He is.

So, if you've not been along to a Muddy Church yet, please do come along and use the time as you choose to, with no pressure to join in anything specific apart from being outdoors. Hopefully warmer weather is on its way, bring a chair if you'd rather not sit on a log and join us for friendship in God's creation.






