## Alleluia! Jesus Lives.

Greetings to you in the name of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. As we enter into this season of Easter, we rejoice again in the truth that Jesus is alive. We celebrate the good news that death could not defeat the Son of the Living God.

Recent information based on the 2021 Census information taken from the Office for National Statistics tells us that 6589 people live within the Mountsorrel Church parish boundaries, and 43.6% of you open declared yourselves to be a Christian. This is good news for me because it means that my usual Sunday attendance in Church should be (give or take) about 2,877 people including 640 children and teenagers. If you've been to Church recently, you will not be surprised to know that we don't usually have a congregation that large. Maybe that's just as well, because we can only seat about one hundred and twenty in each of our Church buildings. But I would love to know what it is that keeps you away.

Further research undertaken by the *Talking Jesus* project reveals that over 43% of the general population believe that the resurrection of Jesus from the dead was a real event that actually took place. I wonder if you would count yourself in that number. Dead people don't usually come back to life, so let me ask you a question: If you truly believe that Jesus rose from the dead (and, statistically, more than two hundred of you do), why would you not want to acknowledge that by being part of our Church? Again, I would be really interested in your thoughts.

I have been a Christian for about as long as I can remember and I know the positive difference that having a living faith can make so I am passionate about sharing my faith experience with others. If, like me, you are happy to talk about your faith with others, most of your neighbours are on your side and willing to listen.

I long for people to come into a vibrant, living faith with the risen Lord Jesus. He rose that first Easter morning, and he still lives today calling men, women and children to give their lives to him. I wonder if you have responded to his call. If not, what is stopping you from doing so today?



We are all grateful for the slightly warmer weather, glimpses of sunshine and lighter evenings at Muddy Church! All signs of



spring, which we were thinking about in March.



As well as enjoying binoculars for exploring and our usual equipment for bug hunting, we had a go at soap carving with spoons with some pretty impressive results! Soap carving is a first step to learning to whittle wood so hopefully we've practised some great skills ready for this! We also planted sunflower seeds and mixed up dough to make stick bread which was cooked over the fire before being smothered in jam or chocolate spread and eaten! We had an interesting experiment with wrapping the bread dough around marshmallows before cooking – this seemed to be going well until the

marshmallows suddenly started melting and oozing through the bread dough; although Lucas, who led this experiment still ate it! For the children, Muddy Church is very much geared to having this sort of freedom to try out ideas they have, so it was the perfect place for such an experiment and we all had fun with it!

## Young Assembly Squad



We continue to visit Christ Church & St Peter's 0116 2302800 1 W

Primary School every Monday lunchtime to work with the children to put together and lead assemblies each term. This term they have planned and led two assemblies.

The first was all about light and allowing our own light to shine from within us. One of the children made lightbulb headbands for us all to wear and we had fairy lights, candles and torches among other lights to set the scene. We focused on Jesus' words from Luke's gospel;

'No one lights a lamp and covers it with a bowl or puts it under a bed. Instead, it is put on the lampstand, so that people will see the light as they come in'.

The children read these words and acted them out and then challenged everyone to think about how they can shine their own lights into the world.

We then showed everyone what a Christingle is explaining each part of the Christingle before lighting one and all singing together.


Our second assembly was all about peace and we thought about how we can all work for peace in our communities even when we can't control whether there is peace in the world.

The children began by mixing up the bible verse 'Happy are those who work for peace; God will call them His children', and everyone had to work out the right order for the words to make sense. They then told and acted out the story of the two donkeys who were tied together and had to learn how to work together to get to their food.

Finally, the children acted out some scenarios where they were starting to argue and everyone had to come up with a better and more peaceful solution for each scenario.

As always, the children leading the assemblies were brilliant and we look forward to our final assembly of this school year later on next term.
