I am quite excited by our current plan which is for our parishes to be part of a Minster Community with Rothley, Sileby, Cossington, Seagrave, Loughborough Emmanuel, Loughborough The Good Shepherd, Thorpeacre and St Barnabas Grange Park. This is a great grouping and I couldn't be happier about it.

Our local coordinating group has discerned that we should look at what each parish can offer to the others in this partnership across five different areas.

The second day will be looking at the draft proposals and amendments and suggesting any further changes necessary. The second day will be on Saturday 9th November meeting from 10am to 3pm at All Saints Church, Thorpeacre.

It would be really helpful to know who is hoping to come along, so please can you email me (contact details on last page) to let me know that you are hoping to be there. We need as many people as possible to join in at this important stage of the process. Please don't simply leave it to others. Do join in and have your say.

Meeting in a small group to worship, study and pray together allows for more interaction and deeper study than is possible during a Sunday morning service.


The Fellowship Group will be meeting at The Vicarage on Wednesday 11th and 25th September, in the evening at 7:00pm.

1944 - 80 - 2024



Operation Market Garden 17th – 25th September 1944

Following D Day and the breakout from Normandy during July and August 1944 the German Army was thought to be beaten and in full retreat. Allied Commanders now sought ways to shorten the path to final victory and a plan was formed for a combined airborne and ground forces assault on the Rhine bridges to open a route into the heart of Germany to end the war for Christmas 1944. The plan was agreed on 10th September and seven days later Operation Market Garden commenced.

The operation had two elements, "Market" the 1st Allied Airborne Army consisting British 1st and US 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions, and "Garden" the ground forces, British 2nd Army's XXX Corps. The Airborne forces were tasked with seizing key bridges and choke points whilst the ground forces moved northwards supporting them and exploiting the gains.

The airborne element was the biggest ever mounted with 34,600 men, 1,900 vehicles and about 260 artillery pieces delivered by parachute and glider aircraft by 1500 aircraft from 22 airfields in the south of England. The two US Airborne Divisions were tasked with taking the southern bridges, those around Eindhoven, Grave and Nijmegen. British 1st Airborne Division were tasked with the most northerly, that between Arnhem and Oosterbeek.

On paper the plan looked challenging but achievable but problems were encountered from the start. The onset of bad weather coupled with fierce German resistance and counter-attacks slowed and at times completely halted the ground forces advance to support the dangerously exposed Airborne Divisions. Their position was worsened as the weather also seriously hindered resupply and reinforcement by air and at Arnhem 1st Airborne were unaware that the Germans had just deployed two SS Panzer Divisions to the area.

The initial airborne landings went well as did the advance north of XXX Corps which despite German resistance linked quickly with US 101st Airborne at Eindhoven and then the US 82nd Airborne at Nijmegen on 19th September. In Arnhem the position was difficult, the bridge had been rapidly secured but the lightly equipped paratroops were now under fierce attack from the Germans armoured forces supported by heavy artillery. By 20th supplies were running low with resupply delayed by the weather. Despite eventual reinforcement the bridge could no longer be defended, and British forces withdrew into the town itself. The Germans followed up with an armoured assault across the bridge and

into the town. Surviving British forces were taken prisoner or killed during intense house-to-house fighting.

On 22nd the Allied Airborne Army's strategic reserve, 1st Polish Independent Airborne Brigade were parachuted in just south-west of Arnhem town to try and rescue the survivors of 1st Airborne. The Germans now tried to bottle up 1st Airborne to prevent escape whilst keeping the Poles stuck to the river banks. The ground forces of XXX Corps, still slowly advancing north, were now at last in range to provide artillery support to cover an escape route. British and Canadian Royal Engineers now managed to move forward, link up with Polish troops and using assault boats, ferry the survivors out of the area. On 27th September, the remaining troops at Arnhem surrendered to the Germans - marking the end of Operation Market Garden.

Despite the failure at Arnhem, Operation Market Garden was partially successful in that other key bridges were in now in Allied control, but the costs were high. At Arnhem alone Allied Forces suffered 1000 dead and up to 6,000 prisoners of war and in the advance north XXX Corps lost 1500. In the following months the Allies lost more men south of Arnhem as the Germans continually attempted to recover lost ground.

On 7th October 1944, US bombers destroyed the bridge at Arnhem to prevent the German use of it as a counter-attack route.

Canadian troops liberated Arnhem on 14th April 1945.
