Remember Remember

I can, at times, be rather forgetful. For example, it has long been a standing joke in our family that I could wrap the children's Christmas stocking presents late on Christmas Eve and then, be just as excited as they were on Christmas morning, because I couldn't remember what the gifts were; or sometimes, I sit down to send an email. I open the email program on my phone or computer, read the ten new emails that have come in and then go off and do something completely different instead - only realising later that I still haven't sent that email.



I don't know if it is down to my ability to be easily distracted, or if it is my lack of ability to concentrate on one thing at a time, or just that I am very good at not remembering things.

That is one very good reason why I am grateful for November. This is the season of remembrance. We begin on All Saints Day (1st November) by remembering the saints of the past – especially those who do not have a dedicated day of their own. 2nd November is All Souls' Day and we remember those who have gone before us in faith – as the writer to the Hebrews calls them, 'a great cloud of witnesses' (Hebrews 12.1) and remembering their faith, encourages us in our own faith journey. Then comes bonfire night (I don't think I'll say too much about that one) and, of course, Remembrance Sunday (10th November) and Armistice Day (11th November) when we remember and give thanks for all those who served in conflicts past and present serving their country in defence of justice and freedom.

This season of remembrance ends with one final flourish: The final day of the Church's year – the Sunday before Advent Sunday – is marked as 'Christ the King'. On this Sunday (24th November) we remember that Jesus Christ is our King of kings. He is the one seated on his throne in heaven ruling over the Church. It is before him that the twenty-four elders fall down and worship as they lay their crowns before the throne and say,

"You are worthy, our Lord and God to receive glory and honour and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being." (Revelation 4.11)

Even if I were to forget everything else, may I never forget that Jesus Christ is the King of kings and Lord of lords. May he be my King now and for ever; and may he be your King too.

Meeting in a small group to worship, study and pray together allows for more interaction and deeper study than is possible during a Sunday morning service.


The Fellowship Group will be meeting at The Vicarage on Wednesdays: 6th and 27th November, and 4th December in the evening at 7:00pm.

Prayer Ideas

At St Peter's and Christ Church we support and pray for a number of different Christian Charities that work in this country and abroad to improve the lives of others and show them God's love and compassion.

Please find some prayer pointers to help us to pray for global issues and the Charities we support and their work throughout the world:

Tearfund:

Sunday November 3rd is the International Day of Prayer for the persecuted church. In the past year around 5,000 Christians have been killed simply because of their faith.

Over 14,000 Christian properties have been attacked and 4,000 Christians detained often in harsh and inhumane conditions. An estimated 316 million Christians live under significant persecution, facing daily threats to their lives, livelihoods and freedoms.

- Pray for persecuted Christians to stay steadfast in their faith.
- Pray for comfort and healing for those who have lost loved ones, homes or livelihoods.
- Ask God to mend broken hearts, restore hope and bring peace to communities.
- Pray for the release of Christians imprisoned for their faith.
- Pray for an end to forced conversions.
- Pray for the protection of female Christians from violence and abductions.
- Pray for God's wisdom and discernment for church leaders as they lead congregations in hostile environments.
- Pray for justice for the victims of persecution and for legal reforms that protect the rights of Christians and other minorities.
- Pray that those who persecute Christians would come to know the love and forgiveness of God.
- Pray for Governments and Organisations to advocate for the rights of Christians and to put pressure on authorities to end the persecution.

War/Conflict:

As we lead up to Armistice Day & Remembrance Sunday we remember the areas of the world where there is currently conflict and its costs;

- Pray for an end to the continued conflict between Ukraine and Russia.
- Pray for peace in the Middle East.
- Pray for those who have lost loved ones, homes, livelihoods and their communities.
- Pray for those who have had to flee their own countries and are now refugees.
- Pray for all the aid agencies who are working in difficult and dangerous situations.
- Pray for the members of our own armed services and the roles they play across the world in different conflict zones.




