# Peace in a Troubled World

After more than fifteen months of fighting, Israel and Gaza have entered into a ceasefire agreement. The missile launchers lay silent, but still ready for action. This is a tentative, yet highly positive, move towards peace. Gazans are returning to home only to discover that, for them, home no longer exists. Their peace is undone once again and their lives are thrown into turmoil by the sheer devastation they meet upon their arrival with almost complete destruction of all property and infrastructure. And yet, the ceasefire agreement still gives a level of peace they have not seen for over a year.

Elsewhere across the Middle East region, and further afield around the world, fighting and warfare continues and men, women and children cannot live in safety and in peace.

But turmoil and a lack of peace is not always caused by war. Each one of you reading this today, will have faced, and may be facing right now, times of chaos and disorder in your lives leading to a lack of peace.

So where, and how, do you find peace today in a troubled world? Maybe you take time out for a retreat or a holiday. Going away from the busy-ness of everyday life and work to find your little place of peace and quiet. If you've got young children, or difficulties in your marriage, this can be exceptionally difficult because families tend to holiday together.

Even when I can't get away, I find peace by reading the promises of God in the Bible. Just a few minutes sitting quietly each day with God, reflecting on his Word and centering yourself in his presence will help to bring you to that place of peace. Here are just a few of the promises found in the Bible. I hope you find them useful.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. *John 14.27* 

When you lie down, you will not be afraid; when you lie down, your sleep will be sweet. *Proverbs 3.24* 

For I hold you by your right hand. I, the Lord your God. And I say to you, 'Don't be afraid. I am here to help you.' *Isaiah 41.13* 

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. *Philippians 4.6-7*

# **Climate Change:**




We've made candle pictures, temple biscuit creations and dove collages as well as enjoying all our usual toys, activities and of course singing.
