One single day that changed the world

So many times in history events have taken place that have shaped the future. History labels these days as days that changed the world. Some of these include the assassination of Julius Caesar in 44BC bringing to an end his powerful rule; Columbus making landfall in the Americas in 1492; the Battle of Waterloo in 1815; the Apollo 11 moon landing in 1969 ending the quest of mankind to land on solid ground outside of earth, the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 uniting East and West Europe; and, of course the fall of the twin towers in 2011 changing so much of our modern world. There have been, and there will be, many more days that change the world.

Whilst it is true that these events have indeed changed the world, there is only one event that truly changed the course of the world for all eternity. That event is recorded for us in scripture and we celebrate these events this month. The death and resurrection of Jesus changed forever the course of eternity.

Since the fall in the garden of Eden when Adam and Eve rejected God, the direction of travel was not looking good. As St Paul reminds us in his letter to the Romans, the wages of sin is death. And ever since the fall, death had been introduced into the world.

The death and resurrection of Jesus changed everything.

God, in his great love for his creation, sent his one and only son, Jesus, to be our Saviour. "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3.16). Through his death on the cross, Jesus paid the penalty for our sin and the sin of all humans defeating death once and for all. By rising from the dead that first Easter morning, he proved that death had been defeated and opened the way for all who put their trust in him to rise to eternal life.

There have been many days that changed the world, but only one that changed eternity. Many people have chosen to believe in Jesus and invite him into their lives changing their eternal destiny. I did this when I was still in primary school. Others will have done this much later. But now that you know this, how will you respond.

Passover Fellowship Meal

We will be celebrating our Passover Meal on Maundy Thursday (17th April) at Christ Church for members of our congregations at Christ Church & St Peter's Church.

Those who came last time found it to be a wonderful occasion. Based on a traditional Jewish Passover Meal, we journey back to the time of Jesus and see how he might have celebrated the last supper with his disciples. The main course of the meal is traditionally roasted lamb so not suitable for vegetarians (a vegetarian option will be available by prior request).

Thank you to those who have volunteered to assist with this event. We now have just enough help to ensure that the evening can go ahead but there is still room for one or two more offers of help, so please let Colin know if you are free and willing to assist with helping to prepare the room (2pm - 4pm), helping to prepare the food (2pm - 5pm), helping to serve the food (during the event), helping to clear up (after the event for about an hour or so).

We start at 7pm and enjoy a wonderful evening of fellowship and food together. To ensure that we prepare sufficient food, it is essential that you reserve a ticket by adding your name to the list in Church or by contacting Colin by phone or email (see back page). Wine forms a central part of the meal too, so please do not drive unless you have to (although we will have a non-alcoholic alternative available).

Sunbeams

As we've continued to learn more about Jesus, we have enjoyed the story of Jesus walking on water, the children loved the water play and painting watery pictures as well as joining in with the story and singing. We also looked at tiny mustard seeds and heard the parable of the mustard seed, as well as creating tree collages with lentils. As we begin to approach Easter, the children enjoyed the story of Mary of Bethany pouring perfume on Jesus' feet and wiping it with her hair, the room smelled lovely after we'd sprayed our own perfume around! They also decorated plant pots and planted a bulb for their mummies for Mother's Day.

Baby Groups

Eight of our mum's and babies have continued with us to experience Starting Rite. So far, we have enjoyed peek-a-boo games and mirror play whilst thinking about how we see God; practised some basic baby massage whilst thinking about how much we love our children and how much God loves us; and played in water and a dark tent with lights (not at the same time) as we thought about choices and baptism. It is, as always, an absolute joy to watch the baby's grow and develop as the weeks go by and to see some of these families come into church at other times too!



Our March session was very wet! As is the ethos of Muddy Church, we carried on regardless but we were definitely all very soggy by 5pm!

We made musical shakers using sticks and beads, planted summer flowering bulbs which will attract butterflies and toasted marshmallows for s'mores. Lots of insects were found including a spider and a millipede – all returned to their homes when we'd enjoyed looking at them.

My favourite part though was the spontaneous child-led activity of jumping in puddles! We'd put a groundsheet down with activities before it started raining and this very quickly became full of puddles as the rain poured down, the children had great fun splashing in the puddles – a joy to watch and a lesson for all of us in their fun with the rain!

We had a very busy Bible Buddies in March when we learned about baby Moses whilst the adults in Church heard about a different part of his life. We enjoyed pretending to be on the river and jumping on lily pads like frogs, hearing the story and creating pictures of Moses in his basket on the river.
