Well done, good and faithful servant!

On Easter Monday, the world heard the news that Pope Francis had died and gone to be with the Lord. Over the following days, many spoke of a man who, in his leadership of the Roman Catholic Church, had been both radical in his compassion and conservative in his doctrine. His leadership style was like a breath of fresh air.

As a leader in God's Church, I set to reflecting on what makes a good Church leader. Many have written books, news/magazine articles, blogs and podcasts on this topic and, if I am honest with

you, don't seem to offer much that distinguishes the Christian leader from any other secular leader. The main thrust being that a good leader needs some or all of the following qualities: Leading by example, humility, integrity, love, compassion.

According to web searches, the good Church leader needs 'to be preaching and teaching the Word of God, providing pastoral care and counselling, leading the Church in worship services, overseeing the spiritual growth of the congregation, providing leadership and direction for the Church.'

These attributes and qualities all go to make a good leader and will certainly help the Church to find focus for her mission. But there is something missing from these and, I believe, it was evident in the life of Pope Francis. The one thing that is missing is that the good Church leader needs, first and foremost, to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.

Jesus leads us in this by example: "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." (Mark 1.35)

Pope Francis' first act as Pope was to ask the people to pray over him. He bowed his head before the thousands gathered in St Peter's square as they prayed silently for him. At the heart of the Good Church leader is the heart of Christ. Only by making Christ the centre of our lives, will any of us be able to lead His Church.

I still have so much to learn about Church leadership. From time to time, I find myself relying on my own strength instead of depending on the Lord. But, day by day, I want to become more like my Saviour who sought the blessing of His Father for everything he did. Thankfully, I don't need to lead the Roman Catholic Church; I don't even need to lead the Church of England; but I do need to be Church leader here in Mountsorrel and so I ask for your prayers, that I may lead with humility and integrity, wisdom, love and compassion; but most of all, that I may remain, first and foremost, an obedient disciple of Jesus Christ.

Tearfund:

- Pray for the continuing conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)
 where thousands of people have fled their homes to escape the violence.
- Pray for families who have been separated in the chaos and for parents who do not know where their children are.
- Pray for peace and stability across the DRC and the wider region.
- Pray for safety, peace of mind, comfort and rest for all our staff and partners working there.
- Pray for South Sudan where the humanitarian crisis persists due to a combination of armed clashes, intercommunal violence, food insecurity, climate change challenges and cuts in humanitarian aid.
- Pray for unity and reconciliation for the leadership of the country and for the South Sudanese people.

Church Mission Society:

- Pray for Muslims and Muslim-background believers in Jesus in the Middle East and North Africa.
- Pray for the team at Jigsaw Kids' Ministries in the Philippines as they work to develop the charity's crisis response processes.



Thy Kingdom Come

Once again, we are invited to spend the days between Ascension Day and Pentecost Sunday in prayer for the Church, the world and our nation especially praying for our friends and family who have not yet come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Our Church buildings will be open throughout the days from 29th May to 8th June for you to visit and spend time in private prayer. There will be the opportunity for you to light a candle as a sign of your prayer.

Each evening from Thursday 29th May until Saturday 7th June, you will have the opportunity to join us at St Peter's Church for a service of Night Prayer (Compline) beginning at 8.30pm. It is a short service that lasts no more than 25minutes. I do hope you will be able to join us.

This is a great time for you to revisit 'Pray for 5' thinking of five people who you would like to see come to faith. Pray for them by name throughout this period asking God to reveal himself to them.

The Lord's Prayer

On top of all of this, we would also like you to take time thinking about and praying through the Lord's Prayer. The Archbishop of York, Rt Revd Stephen Cotterill has written this reflection to help us. Here's what he says:

Just before teaching them the prayer we know as the Lord's Prayer, Jesus told his disciples that God knows what we want before we ask him (Matthew 6:8). So why a prayer at all? Perhaps it's simply this: we don't know what we want. Therefore, the Lord's Prayer is best understood as learning what to want. Which also means that the Lord's Prayer is a pattern for life as well as a pattern for prayer. Coming from the heart of God, through the heart of Jesus to our hearts, and through us to the world, the Lord's Prayer teaches us how to pray and how to live. All in less than 70 words!

Our Father in heaven... First, we call God 'Father' and learn that we are children of God,

and that God is the loving parent, our heavenly Father, who will not let us down - even if human parents sometimes do. But not just my Father. Ours! Everyone who says this prayer is my sister and brother.

Hallowed be your name... Our relationship with God is close, as with a Father. But God is holy; God's name is hallowed. God is the most holy, the most beautiful, the one by whom everything exists and upon whom everything depends.

Your kingdom come; your will be done on earth as in heaven... Here we start to learn what to ask for. Not my kingdom, not my will, but God's. And if we want to learn what God's kingdom looks like and what God's will might be, then we look to Jesus who showed us what God is like, and who in his great need also prayed, not my will be done but yours (Luke 22:42). In this way earth starts to look like heaven and the great biblical vision of 'a new heaven and a new earth' starts to emerge' (Revelation 21:1).

Give us today our daily bread... This means 'Give me enough for today. Stop me wanting more all the time. Give me what I need, not what I want. Show me what enough looks like.' Is there a more important lesson for our world to learn today?

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those against us... This means being honest about ourselves; our foibles, our failures and especially our wilful choosing what we know to be wrong. And then being ready to offer to others the forgiveness we so dearly need ourselves. At the very heart of the Christian faith, we learn that in Jesus God forgives our sins. By his death and resurrection, Jesus sets us free from sin and death. We too must be forgiving.

Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil... This means asking for God's help and guidance when life is tough, when temptation dazzles, and when darkness falls.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever... This means everything comes from God and everything belongs to God, now, and forever more. God's kingdom is not a place, but a life lived in relationship with God. God makes this possible through Jesus whose power and glory are shown in humility, service and sacrifice. This is the life we are called to live if we follow in the way of this prayer.

Amen. This means 'I agree'. But do we? No prayer is said more than this one, but maybe no prayer is meant less. Let's change that. Say the Lord's Prayer and mean it. Let it change your heart. Then it might change the world as well.




INTER-GENERATIONAL WORK
