Too Good To Be True

The word 'traditional' carries with it all sorts of connotations. For some people 'traditional' means dependable, solid, reliable; for other people 'traditional' means old fashioned, dull and boring. A wise man once told me that if you do something once, it is innovation; if you do it a second time, it's an emerging tradition; do it a third time and it's the way you've always done it.

You may or may not consider yourself to be a traditional sort of Christian but it is my guess that you still have your own Christmas traditions. My own Christmas traditions are deep-rooted having been established through my childhood. We tend to carry the most significant of these into adulthood and allow them to adapt and change and then pass them on to the next generation.

It has been a while now, but one Christmas tradition I remember was going Carol Singing as a small group from Church. We'd visit the streets of the parish singing carols and, rather than asking for money, we gave out mince pies. This always threw people — they wanted to pay for them. They could not believe there wasn't some sort of catch. I'm sure if we were to do it again today, it would be even worse. People are so wary of scam calls, texts, emails and anything that seems 'too good to be true'.

But 'too good to be true' is surely the message of Christmas as these scriptures remind us:

'For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God.' *Ephesians 2.8*

'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' *John 3.16*

And 'God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.' *Romans 5.8*

So, this Christmas, be generous in the gifts you give, rejoice in the gifts you are given and know that the best gift of all is the love of God revealed in the gift of Jesus Christ.



Christmas is coming! I know some of us prefer to experience the time of waiting through advent before getting too excited but this is difficult to do as a children and family worker. I am already in the midst of practising the Nativity service, planning the Crib service, school Christmas talks, Christmas Trails and more. And by the time you read this, I will no doubt, have lots of excited children at various groups already counting down the days on their Advent calendars, singing Christmas songs, and telling me about their Christmas trees. Thankfully, I do find some personal time to mark advent properly – this year I'll be reading 'Women of the Nativity' by Paula Gooder; as a busy mum, I find these kind of books most helpful as they are split into several short stories. J.John also has some books with a short reading for each day through Advent. If you're also a busy parent and you'd like to have a go at making some time for yourself with God through Advent, have a chat with me and I can show/loan you a book Bethlehem.

Sunbeams

Sunbeams marked bonfire night with the story of Moses and the burning bush, and Remembrance with the story of Jacob's dream and the stone pillow/pillar. They enjoyed crafting fireworks pictures and poppies.

We are now hearing about and experiencing the Christmas Story and making decorations for our tree at the Christmas tree festival. They've had fun so far hearing about Mary and the angel, and the journey to Bethlehem.

Assembly Squad

The Assembly Squad planned and led a brilliant assembly all about bullying for anti-bullying week in November. They looked at how Elijah felt when Queen Jezebel didn't like him and showed that today, when someone is unkind to us we still have those same feelings that Elijah felt. There was some fantastic acting from the children and a really great message for Key Stage 2 about being kind.

Some of the group are now preparing to lead our Nativity Service at St Peter's.



This half-term we are learning about the Prophets, particularly Isaiah which leads us nicely into Christmas. The children enjoyed making postmen (messengers) and letter writing as we learnt what a prophet is. We then heard Isaiah's message that God



says; 'I have called you by name, you are mine.' We thought about our names, played some name games and made our own name signs which also remind us that God has called us by name and we belong to Him.

Muddy Church

Our first Muddy Walk, led by Kat on October 25th, had an autumnal theme, seeing how many different leaves we could find; big ones, little ones, orange, red, brown, green and even a few silvery ones. Who knew we had such a variety within such a short distance? We stopped off to listen to nature, and to God, praying for our time together and giving thanks for all that we could see around us. As we came to the end of our walk we reflected on the garden of Eden and how we don't always treat nature with the respect that we should.



We finished off back at church with some warming soup and some cheese twists, a real hit with everyone.

Our November walk was an extremely wet day, the floods were up and the rain was pouring! A few of us met at church, but just 2 humans and 1 dog decided to brave the rain and go for the walk. Despite their decision to shelter in a café for a while, they still returned extremely wet!

We extended our tree decoration making over to the Sunday when a few of us made some lovely pine cone Christmas trees for our Muddy Church tree at the Christmas tree festival.




